

## Vernon Hamilton • Final Bio Richmond, VA (2003-07)

**Overview:** Clemson's career and single-season steals leader...an All-ACC Defensive Team selection as a junior and honorable mention All-ACC Defensive selection his senior year...named to the Defensive All-America team by [CollegeInsider.com](http://CollegeInsider.com) in 2005-06...starting point guard from 2003-07...played in 127 career games, third-most in school history, with 95 career starts...first Clemson player in history to record at least 50 steals in three separate seasons...surpassed Terrell McIntyre's four-year steals mark of 194 in just three seasons...concluded his four years with 271 steals, which ranks sixth in ACC history at the conclusion of his career...shattered Clemson's single-season record with 83 as a junior...led the ACC in steals per game as a junior...was a major reason Clemson ranked second nationally in steals per game in 2005-06 and in the top 15 for three straight seasons...that team also established a school record with 352 thefts...earned Clemson's Defensive MVP honor at the 2005-06 awards banquet following the season...ranked in the top six in the ACC in steals per game each of his four years...holds the class records for steals for Clemson freshmen, sophomores, and juniors...Clemson's career leader in steals on a per game basis (2.13)...named Clemson's Most Improved Player in 2004-05...played over 3,600 minutes in his career, sixth in school history...finished his career 17th in school history in career scoring with 1,238 points...scored in double figures in 65 career games...had a positive assist-to-turnover ratio in each of his four seasons with the program...totaled 399 assists, which ranked sixth in school history at the conclusion of his career...first native of Virginia to come to Clemson on a basketball scholarship since Jo Jo Bethea in 1973...all-state and all-conference in football as a wide receiver and defensive back his junior and senior year of high school...no relation to Vincent Hamilton, former Clemson guard of the early 1980s...played in the NABC All-Star game as a senior, where he totaled 13 points and two steals for his team...earned the team's inaugural Road Warrior Award, given to the top performer in road games, at Clemson's awards banquet in 2007.

**In 2006-07:** Started all 36 games at point guard for the Tigers, leading the team to matching the school record for wins (25) in a single season...co-captain along with junior backcourt mate Cliff Hammonds...ranked second on the team in scoring at 12.3 points per game...shot 47 percent from the field, a strong mark for a point guard...second on the team with 122 assists...had a career-best 1.28 assist-to-turnover ratio as a senior...scored in double figures a team-best 29 games...led the team in steals with 70, an average of 1.9 per game which ranked in the top five of the ACC...first Tiger to lead the team in steals four straight years since Terrell McIntyre (1995-99)...had two or more steals in 20 of the 36 games...named to All-ACC Defensive Team by the Fans' Guide, voted on by league coaches...consistent scorer posted 21 points on three occasions and 13 points on 11 occasions...outstanding on the road as a senior, quite a contrast from his junior season...averaged 14.8 points per game and shot 54 percent from the field at road venues...played well in the NIT, where he led the team to the championship game against West Virginia...averaged 12.4 points and 4.4 assists per game as the Tigers went 4-1 in the NIT...leading scorer for Clemson in ACC regular season games at 13.3 points per game.

**Best Games of 2006-07:** Had three 20-point games as a senior...scored 21 on 8-14 shooting at N.C. State...added five rebounds and five assists and led the Tigers to a road victory over the Wolfpack...also added 21 points at Duke, including five in a 0.6 second span...shot 9-15 at Duke and added five rebounds in that heartbreaking loss for the Tigers...posted second career double-double at Wake Forest with 21 points and 10 rebounds...all of his rebounds came off the defensive glass...shot 8-15 in that contest...posted 19 points at Florida State in Clemson's ACC road opener, a 68-66 Tiger win...shot 8-11, including 3-5 on three-pointers, in that contest to spark Clemson early...collected six of Clemson's 20 steals in home game against North Carolina...scored 12 points and had four assists with no turnovers in a road win against South Carolina and its outstanding point guard Tre' Kelley...scored 16 points against Virginia at home...totaled 13 points and seven assists in ACC/Big Ten Challenge win over Minnesota...collected 13 points, six assists, and three steals in win over Georgia South-

ern...posted 13 points and seven assists as well in a home win over SEC rival Georgia...

totalled 14 points and a pair of steals at home versus Duke...posted 10 points, four steals, three assists, and no turnovers on Senior Night versus Miami...hit crucial pair of free throws down the stretch in that game...played well again at the ACC Tournament with 13 points and five rebounds in a controversial loss to Florida State...put up 13 points, six rebounds, and four assists in win over East Tennessee State...hit 4-5 free throws to help ice that win for the Tigers...tallied 13 points, five rebounds, and five steals in second round NIT victory over Ole Miss...nearly posted a double-double with 11 points and nine assists in semifinal NIT win over Air Force...in his final collegiate game, scored 16 points (14 in the second half) against West Virginia...hit 8-16 shots and collected pair of steals versus the Mountaineers.

**In 2005-06:** Starter at point guard for 22 of the first 23 games...only missed start during that time was against #1 Duke after cutting his forehead open during pre-game introductions after chest bumping teammate Steve Allen...came off the bench the final seven games of the season and missed home win over Maryland due to injury...sprained his thumb and elbow late against Boston College and was forced to sit out for the first time in his career versus the Terrapins...strong player off the bench, though, his top two scoring games in his career have been as a reserve...third-leading scorer on the team at 12 points per game...set single-season school record with 83 steals, 2.68 per game...led the league in that category...improved shooter at 44.7 percent overall, 35.5 percent from three-point range...reached double figures 19 times and led the Tigers in scoring on seven different occasions...second on the team in assists with 94 total, just over three per game...first on the team with an average of 30.2 minutes played per game...incredible player inside Littlejohn Coliseum, he averaged 14.9 points per game and shot 50.6 percent at home...had single-game highs for the Clemson team in scoring (31), field goals (14), assists (8), steals (6), and minutes played (42)...named MVP of the San Juan Shootout after leading Clemson to its first eight-team tournament title in 25 years...averaged 13.3 points per game and shot 60 percent from the field in three wins for Clemson at that event...had three or more steals in 19 of his 31 games played...season-high was six versus Wofford...played well again at the ACC Tournament, just as he did his sophomore year...scored 17 points and hit 3-4 from long range against Miami in the first round...more aggressive as a penetrator in 2005-06, he shot 127 free throws after shooting just 167 in first two seasons combined.

**Best Games of 2005-06:** Set his career-high with 31 points against the #1 ranked Duke Blue Devils...shot an amazing 14-19 in that game...also added three steals on top of his breakout offensive performance...his 31 points came off the bench, the most points scored by a Clemson reserve since David Young had 34 against Wake Forest in 1991...scored 24 off the bench versus Georgia Tech on senior day in just 27 minutes...shot 8-11 in that game and 7-9 from the free throw line versus the Yellow Jackets...also had four steals in that contest...started the season solid after posting 15 points, eight assists, and three steals against Coppin State in the second contest of the year...scored 16 points at Penn State and hit 5-8 from the field...also had six assists versus the Nittany Lions in that ACC/Big Ten Challenge matchup...followed that with fine performance against in-state rival South Carolina...scored 16 versus the Gamecocks and hit 6-12 from the field...also had three assists and three steals...hit a miraculous bank three-point shot as the shot clock expired at one point in that contest...scored 12 and grabbed six steals in Wofford win for Clemson...posted 15 points, eight assists, three steals, and two blocks against East Tennessee State...shot 8-12 and scored 18 points in San Juan second round win over Holy Cross...in the championship game versus Akron, he had 16 points, four assists, and no turnovers in 29 minutes of action to earn MVP honors...scored 13 and had four assists against Elon...posted 13 points, four assists, and four steals at Virginia...shot 8-18 and scored 21 points, then a career-high, in overtime victory over Wake Forest...hit 3-7 from three-point range against the Deacons and also collected four steals...helped spark comeback win at Georgia Tech with 12 points, five assists, and four steals...posted 15 points, five assists, and five steals against N.C. State in a double overtime thriller...had just two turnovers in 42 minutes played against the Wolf-

pack...scored 11 points and grabbed two steals at North Carolina...tallied four steals before injuring

himself diving for a loose ball late at Boston College...scored nine points and collected five steals in home rout of Virginia...had key deflection late in the game at Virginia Tech, allowing Clemson to seal the come-from-behind victory over the Hokies in Cassell Coliseum...posted 14 points and hit 10-12 free throws in first round NIT win over Louisiana Tech...the 10 free throws tied his career-high for made charity shots...big reason the Tigers shot well from the line down the stretch in that game, allowing Clemson to win its first postseason game in seven years...tallied three of Clemson's 13 steals at Louisville.

**In 2004-05:** Started 19 games overall, including each of the last 15...had 68 steals against just 65 personal fouls, just the second Clemson player in the last 17 years to have more steals than fouls for the course of a season (Tony Stockman was the other)...in addition to his defensive abilities, also third on the team in assists with 82, and fifth on the club in scoring with a 6.8 average...fourth on the 2004-05 Tiger team in playing time with a 25.5 minutes per game figure...finished the year strong, he made 11 of his last 23 field goals and had a 24/15 assist/turnover ratio over the last five games of the season...scored in double figures in five of the last eight games after he scored in double figures in just three of the first 24...had at least one steal in each of his last eight games and finished the year with 68, second most in Clemson history for a season...his 2.12 steals per game for the course of the season was fourth best in Clemson history...ranked third in the ACC in steals per game, he was 14th in assists per game...more aggressive in getting to the foul line in the second half of the season, he took 29 of his 50 free throw attempts over the last eight games of the season, he did not attempt a free throw in the seven games prior to that and had just 21 free throw attempts for the first 24 games of the year...Clemson's second leading scorer at the ACC Tournament with an 11.5 average... included a 16-point game against North Carolina in the second round that was his season high...made 7-15 shots from the field and 8-12 from the foul line in the two games of the ACC Tournament...played well against the National Champion Tar Heels, in three games he had 30 points and nine steals...improved in his ball handling at the end of the season, he had 35 turnovers in the last 15 games, after committing 49 in the first 17 games...started each of the last 15 games at point guard and had 19 starts for the year... in those 15 games, had 106 points, 40 rebounds, 46 assists and 35 turnovers...his appearance in the lineup paralleled Clemson's improvement on offense over the last 15 games...Clemson won five of the last eight and Hamilton's performance at the point on offense and defense had a lot to do with it...played well in Hawaii, he was Clemson's third leading scorer with an 11.0 average and he shot 54.5 percent from the field...led Clemson with nine steals in the three games in the Rainbow Classic...had 15 steals over the first three games of the year, first Tiger in history to have 15 steals over any three-game period, never mind the first three games...had five in the opener against Hampton, then a career high six against UNC-Asheville in the second game followed by four at Boston College...the six steals against UNC-Asheville tied for the most by a Clemson player under Oliver Purnell.

**Best Games of 2004-05:** Had 16 points on 4-9 field goals and 7-8 free throws in head-to-head battle with Raymond Felton, the number-five selection of the NBA draft, and National Champion North Carolina in the MCI Center at the ACC Tournament...also had five assists, four rebounds and three steals in 28 minutes in his finest all-around game of the year...that was his season high in scoring and fourth highest scoring game of his Clemson career... had first double figure scoring game of the year in an ACC game when he had 10 against fourth-ranked North Carolina on Feb. 19... made 3-6 shots from the field and had three steals in 28 minutes...had season high eight assists against just two turnovers at Georgia Tech in the final regular season game...had 11 points in win over Virginia Tech on Senior Night to join Sharrod Ford as Clemson's double figure scorers in that game...had big impact on Clemson's win at Maryland, he had eight points and four steals, he hit 3-5 shots from the field...had 12 points on one field goal and 10 free throws, and had just two turnovers in 29 minutes in the win over Florida State...had 13 points against Georgetown, he also contributed five steals, then had 11 points on 5-6 shooting in win over Indiana State...finished the year strong in the NIT with 10-point performance at Texas A&M, he also had team best six assists against just two turnovers and added two steals.

**In 2003-04:** Started each of the first 16 games of the year and 17 over the course of the season...just fifth freshman to start at point guard for Clemson

for the course of the season since freshmen became eligible in 1972-73...struggled from a ball handling standpoint early in the season, but improved at the conclusion of the season...had just four turnovers in four-game period from Feb. 18 to 28...had back-to-back turnover less games against Virginia and at Maryland ...led Clemson in games leading the Tigers in assists with 13...tied for the team lead in scoring inside the last five minutes of games decided by 10 or less with 36 points...actually led the Tigers in rebounding five times, third most games on the team...solid rebounder for a point guard, he had 104 for the season, a 3.7 average...had 11 rebounds against Boston College, joining Edward Scott as only Clemson point guard in the last 10 years to have double figures in rebounding in one game...had a better scoring average, rebound average and field goal percentage than Edward Scott had when he was the starting point guard as a freshman in 1999-00...held his own in matchups with freshman Chris Paul of Wake Forest, Hamilton had 25 points and nine assists in two games against the Demon Deacons...had nine double figure scoring games for the season...had 30/11 assist/turnover ratio in six-game period from December 20 to January 13...finished the year eighth in the ACC in assists and sixth in steals...second to Chris Paul of Wake Forest among ACC freshmen in both categories...his 7.3 scoring average was eighth among freshmen and his 3.7 rebounding average was fifth among freshmen in the ACC, best among the guards...named honorable mention freshman All-ACC team.

**Best Games of 2003-04:** Aforementioned Boston College game was his best of the year when he missed a triple double by just one assist...played big a role in Clemson's win over 12th-ranked North Carolina on January 31, he scored 10 points, had five rebounds and four assists in 29 minutes...big reason for Clemson's win over Florida State on January 13, he had seven points, seven assists, five rebounds and five steals...had three steals in last 10 minutes of the game, all came at key moments...had defensive play of the year when he stole ball with a leaping deflection to prevent a certain dunk by Anthony Richardson in the Florida State win at Clemson...led Clemson in scoring, rebounding and assists at #4 Wake Forest with 17 points, six rebounds and five assists, his second "Triple Leadership" of the year...his 18 points were key to overtime victory against NCAA Tournament bound East Tennessee State...made 8-10 free throws in that game, many down the stretch...had nine rebounds at Cincinnati, the top rebounder in the game for either team...had eight assists against High Point...had 12 points, eight assists and four steals to key the seven-point win over High Point...contributed 15 points and five steals to go with no turnovers in 28 minutes in the seven point win over Wofford...had career high 19 points in ACC Tournament game against Virginia to lead the Tigers in scoring.

**In High School:** Averaged 24.1 points, 7.3 assists, 5.7 rebounds, two steals per game as a senior in 2002-03...scored 25 or more points 13 times for Benedictine High School...led team to first VISBA Division 1 Championship in school history...his high school team won the Virginia State Catholic League Championship...Hamilton was MVP of VISBA State Tournament...scored 35 points in the semifinals and 31 points in the finals of the VISBA Championships...MOP of the Virginia State Catholic Tournament...VISBA 1st Team All-State Selection...MOP of Benedictine Capital Classic Tournament...led team to 24-5 record...co-captain of high school team as a senior...**Richmond Times Dispatch** first-team All-Metro Selection...**Richmond Times Dispatch** In-Sync Tournament All-Tournament team for four straight years and MVP of the event as a freshman in 2001...played in the ADIDAS Big Time Tournament in Las Vegas, NV in 2000 and 2001...on the gridiron, had eight interceptions and 40 tackles in 2002...had 71 receptions for 1,272 yards and 19 touchdowns in 11 games in 2002...regarded as one of the top receiver prospects in Virginia as a senior...2002 Co-captain of football team...member of 2002 Division III VISFA Runner-Up...member of 2001 Division III VISFA State Champions...2002 VISFA 1st Team All-State Selection at defensive back and wide receiver...2001 VISFA 1st Team All-State selection at defensive back and wide receiver...2002 Richmond Times Dispatch 1st Team All-Metro selection at defensive back...2001 Richmond Times Dispatch 1st Team All-Metro selection at wide receiver...football team's Most Valuable Defensive Player of 2002...football team's Most Valuable Offensive Player of 2001...two-year starter and letterman in football...son of Brenda and Vernon Hamilton...selected Clemson over Utah, West Virginia, Colorado, Virginia Tech, and Richmond...born Vernon Wesley Hamilton on December 28, 1984...majored in PRTM (Sport Management).
