2002-03 Notes

- The Tar Heels finished in ninth place at last year's NCAA Championships, marking Carolina's 25th top-20 and 15th top-10 finish in school history and UNC's 33rd trip to the prestigious event. Senior Ramon Bescansa led the Tar Heels as Bescansa tied for 22nd place. The 72-hole event was played at Karsten Creek, a par 72, 7,095-yard layout, in Stillwater, Okla. Carolina finished in fourth place at the NCAA East Regional in Manhattan, Kan., as Dustin Bray was the low for Carolina, tying for 14th place.
- Last year marked Head Coach John Inman's fifth trip to the NCAAs as a coach. His teams posted 10th-place finishes at the NCAA Championships in 1999 and 2000, a 17th-place finish in 2002 and a tie for ninth place last year. In 2001, the Tar Heels did not advance from the NCAA Central Regional. Inman, however, is no stranger to NCAA play as he captured the NCAA Individual Championship in 1984 when he was a senior on the Tar Heel team.
- The Tar Heels were ranked 10th in the final Golfweek/Sagarin Rankings while Dustin Bray was ranked 14th in the individual rankings and Richard Treis was ranked 32nd.
- Carolina finished third at the Atlantic Coast Conference Championship which was played at the Old North State Club in New London, N.C. However, Carolina's Richard Treis topped all players capturing the individual title after firing a five-under-par 211 total. Clemson won the team title.
- Three Tar Heels were selected to the 2003 All-ACC team. Junior Dustin Bray was named all-conference for the third consecutive year and was joined on the 13-man squad by senior Ramon Bescansa and junior Richard Treis.
- Dustin Bray was selected to the 2002-03 PING All-America first team while Treis was named honorable mention. Treis was also named a Cleveland Golf All-America Scholar and named to the Verizon Academic All-District III At-Large Second Team.
- Carolina won two tournament titles this year. The Tar Heels won the Seminole Intercollegiate in Tallahassee, Fla., after firing a 15-under-par 849 total. Then one week later Carolina won the Birkdale Collegiate Classic in Huntersville, N.C., with a three-under 573 total.
- Three Tar Heels won individual championships on five occasions last year. Dustin Bray won three tournaments, two coming in the fall. Bray captured individual medalist honors at The International Collegiate in St. Andrews, Scotland, and tied for first place at The Ridges Intercollegiate in Jonesborough, Tenn. Last spring, Bray captured the title at the Seminole Intercollegiate, his fifth victory as a Tar Heel. Ramon Bescansa won the Birkdale Collegiate Classic, his first collegiate victory, and Richard Treis captured the ACC Championship, the second consecutive year a Tar Heel has captured the conference crown as Bray won the title in 2002.

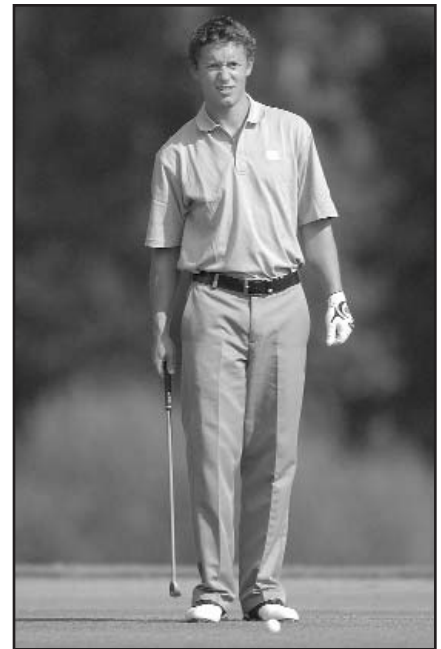

2003 Fall Notes

•Carolina captured the team championship in their last two tournaments of the fall campaign, the Franklin Street Partners Invitational and the Duke Golf Classic. At the Franklin Street Partners Invitational played in Chapel Hill, Carolina finished four strokes ahead of Georgia Southern with rounds of 288-298-289 for an 875 total. Dustin Bray tied for individual medalist honors while Ted Smith tied for third place, Will Dottley tied for sixth place and Kevin Silva tied for 20th. A couple weeks later at the Duke Golf Classic in Durham, the Tar Heels once again topped the field, finishing one stroke ahead of runner-up Illinois after carding rounds of 292-284-292 for an 868 total. Dustin Bray captured the individual title, the seventh win of his collegiate career, to become the winningest Tar Heel in school history. Martin Ureta tied for 11th place, Ted Smith tied for 27th place and Kevin Silva tied for 30th. In the Tar Heels' other two tournaments, they tied for seventh place at the Ping/Golfweek Preview and finished 10th at the Bank of Tennessee at The Ridges Intercollegiate.

•Dustin Bray, a senior from Asheboro, N.C., became the winningest Tar Heel in school history last fall, capturing two tournament titles and bringing his total collegiate victories to seven. Bray was co-medalist of the Franklin Street Partners Invitational carding a three-under-par 213 total, and champion of the Duke Golf Classic, firing a nine-under 207 total. Bray also tied for 20th place at the Ping/Golfweek Preview and concluded the fall with a 71.91 stroke average to lead the team. He posted sub-par scores in five of his 11 rounds last fall. 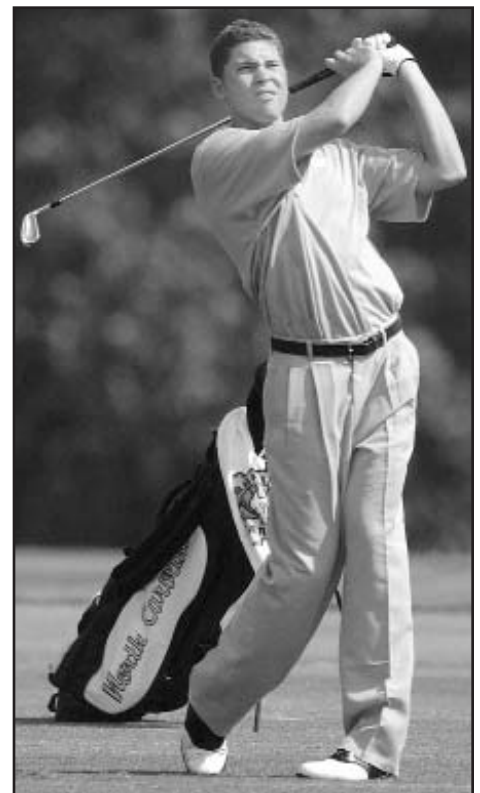
